### Benefits of the BIL and IRA

- ♦ BIL became law on November 15, 2021
- ♦ IRA became law on August 16, 2022
- Historic, once-in-a-generation investment
- Modernization and resiliency of power grid
- ♦ Tax credits and rebates for households and businesses

## **Rhode Island Investments**

- ♦ State Energy Program \$3.2 million
- EV Charging Infrastructure \$23 million over five years
- ♦ Grid Resiliency \$1.7 million for five years
- Home Electrification and Weatherization- \$64 million
