Energy Efficiency & Climate Public Awareness Campaign

RI Building Decarbonization Bill

Emily Koo, Senior Policy Advocate & Rhode Island Program Director at Acadia Center and Amanda Barker, RI Policy Advocate at Green Energy Consumers Alliance, will brief Councilors on a bill that has been introduced in the Rhode Island General Assembly to promote energy efficiency and decarbonization in buildings.
